## Business Law: ***Street Law***

The below website is a great simulation when teaching any law students about Voir Dire (jury selection process).

Students get to choose if they want a civil or criminal case then they get to choose if they will represent the defense or plaintiff/prosecutor.

They read the appropriate case and then read bios on the potential jurors. They must select 12 jurors that they feel will most likely favor their side.

After 12 jurors are selected, students will receive a score on how well they've done.

I pair students up and have them pick the best jury they can. The team who scores highest on the first try gets extra credit points on their next quiz.

If you do not have a computer lab available to your class or if your network filters out this website, you can download a printable version from this site as well.

The kids love it. They usually try two or three times to increase their score.
